Camp Rules

Not every situation that arises will be covered here and, for that reason, it may become necessary for additional rules to be established.

- All campers are expected to abide by the off limit areas (i.e., no boys on the girls' side of camp and vice versa).
- Telectronic devices such as radios, televisions, CD players, iPods and Kindles, etc. are not permitted. (This is one of the ways we attempt to reduce the influence of the world upon our campers.) Items such as firearms, knives and fireworks are forbidden. We ask that cell phones or pagers not be used at camp; however, if you feel it is absolutely necessary to bring a cell phone into camp, please silence it during all classes and services.
- Respect for other people and their property is to be demonstrated at all times. No one is to enter another camper's cabin nor use or "inspect" another's belongings without the owner's expressed consent. Behavior of all those attending camp should exemplify the very best in Christian living.
- All clothing and swimwear is to be kept within the realm of Christian modesty. A covering is to be worn to and from the swimming pool. Spaghetti straps, midriff-exposing tops, short shorts or anything else that shows underclothing and/or the stomach area is prohibited.
- For each camper's safety, instructions posted or announced by the camp director, nurse, lifeguard or other staff member must be followed.
- Attendance at all scheduled events is mandatory. All youth campers are expected to sit with their cabin counselor during morning assembly and evening services. Name tags are provided upon your arrival at camp, and these must be worn by each camper at all times, except when showering or sleeping. Leaving camp is allowed only with the consent of the camp director, nurse or registrar.
- <u>Smoking is strongly discouraged</u> and is only permitted for adults (18 years or older) in designated areas during free time.

Only God's Word contains complete instructions for living. Please follow the guidance found in the Bible, as well as the letter and spirit of the above listed rules and guidelines.
